

May was another great month to be a part of **HomeMission**. A lot of planning and man hours go into getting ready for workshops, **Revive Us Again events**, and just every day ideas and happenings as we work to improve every aspect of how we function in **HomeMission**. Many people put in countless hours behind the scenes to make sure all of these things come together smoothly, and most of the time these things go unnoticed and unheralded. But stepping into these different roles this month has really given me an increased appreciation for all the work that goes in behind the scenes by people like **Karen Jones, Becky Swaim, Fara Robertson, April Askew,** and many others who help organize everything we do. We are thankful to all our staff involved in making the evangelism part of **HomeMission** workable and effective!

We began May finishing the campaign at the West Freeway church of Christ in White Settlement, Texas. 11 souls were baptized into Christ with one restoration. All of these have mentors who are following up with them in study and in encouragement. We then went on to work with the **Forney church of Christ.** This small congregation has three elders& a a loving and active group. We did a launch session there. Then, we went to **West Virginia** to work with the **Hopewell** church of Christ in Wasington county. This congregation of 100 has 4 elders. Next year will be 150 years in existence. As they were building their original building, someone came by and asked them what they were doing. They responded, "we are building a new church building". The passerby said, "I hope you do well". The name stuck and they have used that name to identify the Lord's church in that area. Again we did a launch session. It went "well", we "hope"! From there we traveled to northern Michigan to work with the Harbor Springs church of Christ. They are currently down to 3 ladies. But they are trying very hard. One woman is in a study with 19 people at a senior center. We left materials that will help, and in God's timing, many will obey the gospel. We also did the Launch session at their building and several of the Northern Michigan churches of Christ attended on Saturday. Besides the Harbor Springs church, we held the launch session for representatives of the Alpena church of Christ, the Cheboygan church of Christ, the Atlanta church of Christ, the Beulah church of Christ; all from Northern Michigan. Then on Sunday, we repeated the launch for the Rogers City church of Christ with the Killen church (Killen **Alabama)** attending. After this, we travelled to Nashville to meet with some brethren and the elders at the Concord Road church of Christ in Brentwood Tennessee. Finally, we went to the Everman church of Christ in the Fort Worth area. They are a mixed language church with English and Spanish. I had an interpreter while I preached and taught class. We will set up a launch session with them later.
