If you are like me, you are getting 20 e-mails and texts every day asking for funds for politicians, dogs and cats, and victims of all kinds. It boggles my mind. There are some I really want to help, but then there are needs at home, taxes to pay, and children who need help. Besides that, the cost of everything has gone through the roof. Unfortunately, the work of **HomeMission** must have funding to go forward. While the need to help struggling churches is getting greater, the need to fund this activity is also rising. This year, we set a goal of \$250,000 for end-of-the-year contributions. So far, God has blessed us with just over \$137,923.

Would you consider helping us meet our goals so we can meet the demands of churches needing assistance? Remember, the United States is the third-largest mission field in the world. While 10 churches a month are closing, 97% of churches that **HomeMission** assists are still open, and many are growing. One church went from fewer than 20 to over 100 on most Sundays. Foreign missions will continue to suffer if American churches continue to close. Thank you for your love and support for the Lord's church through the work of **HomeMission**. Remember, we do not charge for our materials or expenses. Because of your generosity, we can continue to assist congregations of 4, 8, 15, 30, and more. May you all have a wonderful Holiday season, and may 2026 be the best year ever for saving souls and saving churches. All glory and honor goes to Him who gives the increase!

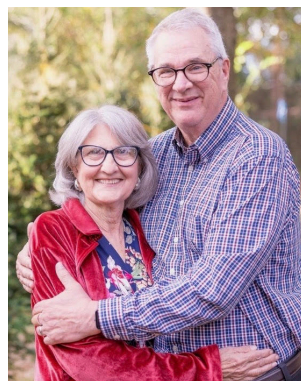

HomeMission Statistics through November 2025

1. Churches have reported 1182 baptisms so far in 2025. 1174 were reported in 2024.
2. We have worked with (in some way) 201 churches in 42 states so far this year. We have helped over 700 churches in all 50 states in the past 10 years.
3. Since January, we have supplied \$182,560.16 worth of materials, tools, and Bibles at no cost to the congregations. This is only possible because of churches of Christ and individuals around the country who support this effort.
4. Fifteen larger congregations have worked with sixteen smaller ones through **HomeMission**. Most of these have helped with Vacation Bible School, door-knocking, or supplies. Two are helping with building construction.
5. Of the 700-plus churches **HomeMission** has worked with over the past 9 years in some way, 97% are still up and running and trying hard to grow.
6. **HomeMission** is adding two regional full-time evangelists; one to work in Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico, and Colorado, and the other will live in Ohio and work primarily with West Virginia, Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky, and Western Pennsylvania. We have been praying for this to happen. The call for assistance is increasing. They will be trained to train others and build a team that works with them. We plan to add one more evangelist in eastern Pennsylvania next year to work in the Northeast, God willing.
7. Elder'sNet (a quarterly publication for elders by elders) is being sent to 738 elders in 31 states representing 224 congregations around the country. Ask your elders if they are receiving this quarterly newsletter.
8. The fourth year of the West Freeway School of Evangelism has now started. 3 students are currently studying. If you know of anyone who would like to attend the school next year, there is no charge for the school. They can come on-site or via Zoom. Please contact Chris Graham if interested (817-797-6325).

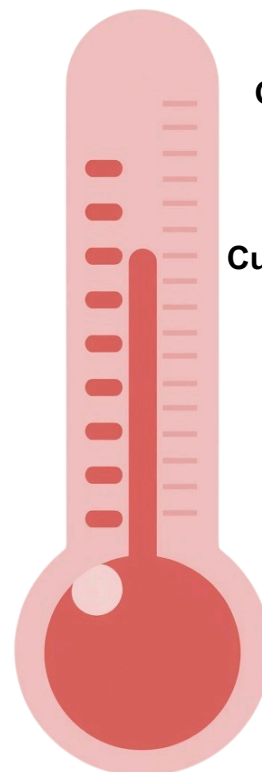

- Perfect for ladies' Bible classes, fostering discussion and accountability.
- Neighborhood Bible studies: Host in homes, coffee shops, or libraries to reach women outside church walls.
- Prison or recovery ministries: Stories of resilience and faith resonate deeply with women overcoming hardship.
- Retreats & conferences: A 12-lesson structure adapts into breakout sessions or weekend studies.

Evangelist Activity Reports: November

DANNY ARAGON

First, this past month has been a great month for me as I continue to work with **HomeMission**. I traveled to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, to spend Thanksgiving with my daughter and her family. Before I left, I made appointments to meet with the 4th St. congregation there and with the Sand Point church in **Sand Point, ID**. I also had the opportunity to visit with the preacher at La Feria church of Christ (TX). We visited about the work they are doing with the Habanero Ministry, and how they have incorporated the Hispanic (Spanish-speaking) brethren to further their work. They have also been successful in setting up Bible studies with visitors as they contact them through the Habanero Ministry. Additionally, I was also able to hold two Bible studies here in **Flower Mound, TX**, with people I made contact with during prayer walks in the park. God has been really good in allowing me to contact many people in this community. Second, as I visited the 4th St. church in **Coeur d'Alene, ID**, I was able to present the **HomeMission** program to the leadership first, then to the church on November 30th. The church there has faced many trials this past year; however, there are those continuing to meet and encourage one another in love and good deeds. They seemed very excited about **HomeMission** and will discuss amongst themselves regarding more information and next steps. They have an eldership and minister in place and ready to work. Thirdly, in Sand Point, ID, I was able to visit one Sunday with the leadership of the church and leave the **HomeMission** introduction book with them. The next day, they asked if I could come up that Wednesday and present **HomeMission** to the church. Afterward, I met with the leadership, and they were currently finishing up a program called "Making Disciples," but they were interested in knowing more about **HomeMission**.

RODNEY CARTER

Ave T church of Christ/Temple, TX/ I spoke with Joe Burns (former elder) and Jevon Westmoreland (Habanero Coordinator). Jevon told me that the card ministry is going well, and every visitor is being mailed a "Thank You for Visiting" card. I also spoke with Pedro Evans (Hispanic minister), and he informed me that he was looking to retire within the next few months; a search for a new minister is already in progress, but anyone interested can contact me, and I will put him in contact with Pedro. The Hispanic congregation averages 10-15 each Sunday but desires to grow. Temple has a Hispanic population of approximately 21,000 (26.2% of the total population) as of the 2020 census. **Tanglewood church of Christ/Odessa, TX/** I spoke with Kevin Adkinson and suggested that the congregation put up a booth at local holiday events in the Odessa community so that residents and visitors are aware of the congregation. He was excited about the idea and the potential to bring others to worship God in spirit and in truth. Saturday for the Savior (visitation) is still going strong. **Johnson City church of Christ/ Johnson City, TX/** I spoke with Will Armagost, and community awareness is the focus for December. He will be keeping their Facebook page updated with future events.

DWAYNE HAGEMEIER

November 16, 2025/ **North Side Church of Christ, Athens, TX/** I conducted a LAUNCH for this small congregation. Much enthusiasm was demonstrated each day of the launch. There were several goals set by this congregation that are designed to increase attendance and bring in missing and former members. A friends and family day was planned for the last Sunday in November that resulted in a large attendance from former members as well as friends and family from the immediate area. This congregation has a usual Sunday attendance of 9 to 12. The friends and family meeting generated an estimated 40 in attendance. In attendance at this LAUNCH were Bill and Linda Hawkins, who are in training to be evangelists for HomeMission. November 15, 2025/ USAF Airman Jacob McClain, **Goldsboro, NC/** Approximately 250 printed materials were delivered to Airman McClain for use in his evangelistic efforts at the Veterans' Retirement and Nursing Home in Goldsboro, North Carolina. Jacob is stationed there and has adopted this nursing home as an evangelistic effort. He attends the Oak Forest Church of Christ in Goldsboro. May God bless this young man as he serves God while in the U.S Air Force. Related: Efforts continue to be made to help with repairs to the building at the **North Side church of Christ in Athens, TX**. The building needs a new roof very badly. The congregation has obtained enough money to purchase the materials needed for roof and structure repairs. We are in the process of trying to obtain labor for the repairs, as the congregation is all elderly folks, unable to do the work themselves. I will also begin the *search for new songbooks and lesson materials for both teen and primary age groups*.

Meanwhile, I am staying in touch by phone call weekly (or more often as needed) to encourage the church.

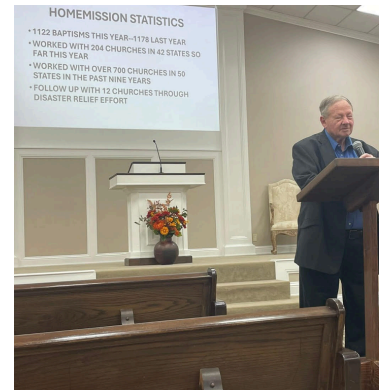

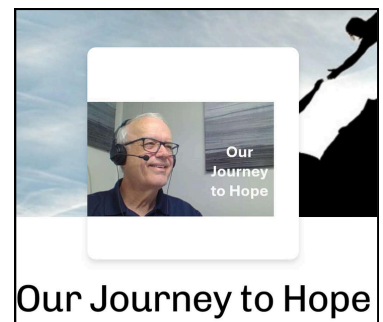
